### RESEARCH INTENT

- Allow Torrance to make autonomous public health decisions in public health emergencies
- CDPH can override any local reopening and safety guidance in the event of a public health emergency.
- CDPH could require localities follow guidance from their county

# PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT **RESPONSIBILITIES**



# **TORRANCE PHD RESPONSIBILITIES (1/2)**

- 1. Collection and analysis of public health statistics
- 2. Health education programs
- 3. Communicable disease control services
- 4. Medical, nursing, educational, and other services to promote maternal and child health
- 5. Environmental health and sanitation services
- 6. Public health laboratory services

# **TORRANCE PHD RESPONSIBILITIES (2/2)**

- 7. Nutrition services
- 8. Chronic disease prevention or mitigation services
- 9. Services directed to the social factors affecting health
- 10. Occupational health promotion
- 11. Family planning services
- 12. Public health nursing services

# **CITY UPDATES**



## **BEVERLY HILLS**

Not planning to establish a public health department.

 Researching how existing services can improve public health.

• Example: EMT's providing follow-up visits to those who used ambulance services.

# **LONG BEACH**

#### **Health and Human Services Department**

- Adjusted 2023 expenditure: \$204,752,945
- Adopted 2024 expenditure: \$187,732,395
- Adopted 2024 revenues: \$170,025,693
- Adopted 2024 Fund Impact: -\$17,706,702

# **PASADENA**

#### **Public Health Department**

Actual Expenditures in FY 2022-23: \$19,213,000

Actual Revenues in FY 2022-23: \$18,392,000

• FY 2024 Adopted Budget of \$23,819,955

# **WEST COVINA**

- Provisional approval estimated in 2024
  - CDPH approval process under internal review
  - Still researching funding

- Performing a Community Health Needs Assessment Survey.
  - Required for Public Health Departments and Hospitals

## **SANTA ANA**

Considered a Community Health Strategist position.

Decided not to develop this position.

Only found special operating program funding


 No funding to start up the health department has been found.

• Startup sources: General fund or secure a legislative appropriation.


# COUNCILMEMBER SHEIKH HEALTH INDICATORS COMPARISON




# PLACES: LOCAL HEALTH INDICATORS COMPARISON





# **MAYOR CHEN**

# **FINDINGS**

 Used \$500,000 from the American Recovery Act COVID-19 assistance funding and \$0 from the General Fund

# **POSITION OVERVIEW**

- \$580,000 over three full-time positions.
- Active pursuit of federal and state grants
- Monitoring and reporting on community conditions
- Strategy development for community services and land use
- Advocacy with county public health
- Community and philanthropic cultivation and partnership

# BENEFITS AND LIMITATIONS



# **BENEFITS**

Community-specific programs and interventions

 Resources not split among vulnerable populations across the County

 Authority to create our own budgets as well as establish taxes and fees for public health

# **LIMITATIONS**

- State could mandate CDPH or County emergency orders or safety guidance
- Duplicative administrative infrastructure results in:
  - Fragmented or redundant services
  - Inefficient disease control and emergency preparedness
- Loss of economy of scaling
- No funds from the County tax base

# **OPTIONS**

- Option 1: Accept/File, direct Staff to bring forth a subsequent update once the City of West Covina has established their Public Health Department for a full one-year period
- Option 2: Accept/File, direct Staff to bring forth a subsequent update based on Council's priorities or additional research inquiries
- Option 3: Accept/File, direct Staff to halt research efforts on a potential establishment of a City-operated Public Health Department at this time
